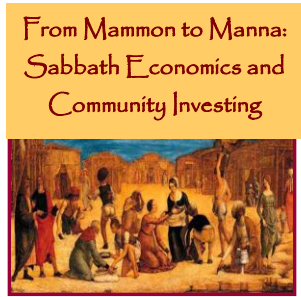
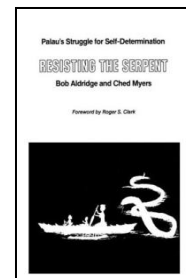


Who Will Roll Away the Stone? Discipleship Queries for First World Christians (Orbis, 1994), Ched Myers. This sequel to *Binding the Strong Man* is a comprehensive articulation of a North American theology of liberation, justice and peace. Paper, 495 pp. **\$35.**



Say to This Mountain: Mark's Story of Discipleship (1996), Ched Myers with M. Dennis, J. Nangle, C. Moe-Lobeda and S. Taylor. A popular version of *Binding the Strong Man*, combined with reflections on the contemporary relevance of the text to today's context. Ideal for study groups. Paper, 240 pp. **\$24.**

Resisting the Serpent: Palau's Struggle for Self-Determination to This Mountain: Mark's Story of Discipleship (1990), Ched Myers and Bob Aldridge. An account of the efforts of this small Micronesian nation to inaugurate a nuclear-free Constitution in the face of U.S. Militarism, and a reflection on indigenous sovereignty. Paper, 210 pp. **\$12.**
